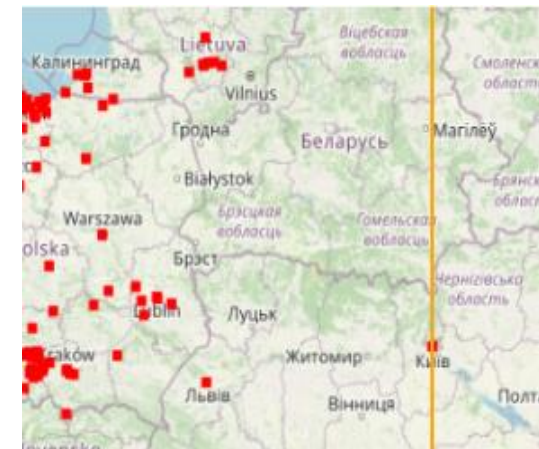

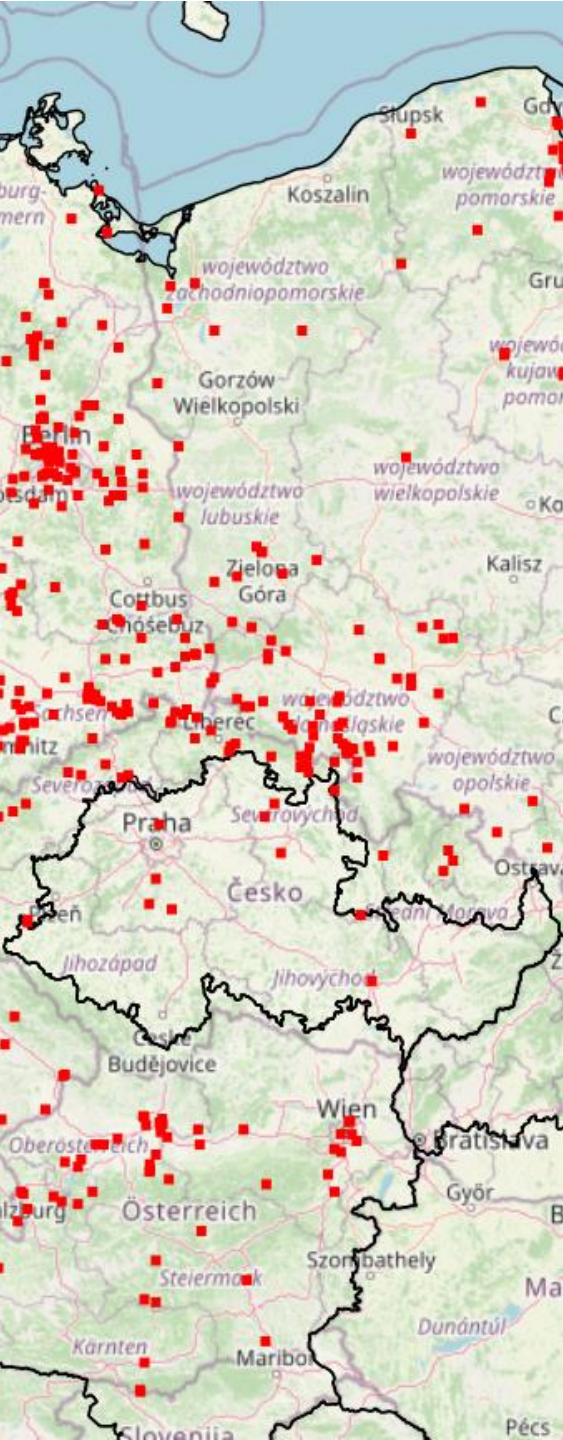

## EHRI RESEARCH (EXTENSIVE)

The state archival system in the Czech Republic consists of the National Archives and 7 regional and local archives. The National Archives and the 7 regional archives are subordinate to the National Archival Administration (Odbor archivní správy a spisové služby) of the Ministry of Interior. The 70 district archives are subordinated to the regional archives. Furthermore, there are five municipal archives worth emphasizing, in Prague, Brno, Plzeň and Ústí nad Labem. In addition to these state archives, there are also museums, seminars and private archives.

Collections relating to the Second World War and the Holocaust can be found not only in the abovementioned state archives, but also in the Archive of Military History, the Archive of the Ministry of the Interior, the Archive of the Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic and the Institute for the Study of Totalitarian Regimes (which holds the archives of the former Czechoslovak security services and extensive materials from the Ministry of the Interior, including the Prague City Archive). Furthermore, there is the Terezín Memorial in the Theresienstadt ghetto which acts both as a state museum and research institution. Other institutions doing research and collecting documents on the Holocaust include the Jewish Museum in Prague and the Terezin Initiative Institute, also based in Prague, which was founded by former inmates of the Theresienstadt ghetto. EHRI has identified several archival guides on the Czech Republic which are listed in the extensive report. The report prepared a Terezín (Theresienstadt) Research Guide which links together the existing research institutions on this ghetto, interprets their history and provides contextual information. The "Councils" Research Guide also contains data about relevant collections in the Czech Republic.

## A. EHRI approach to the Czech Republic: Pre-existing Research and expert support

In the case of the Czech Republic, EHRI was able to rely on a number of pre-existing research works including Livia Rothkirchen's *The Jews of Bohemia and Moravia. Facing the Holocaust*, the works by Miroslav Kárný, the Theresienstädter Studien und Dokumente and the Terezin Initiative. EHRI identified a number of resources useful for Holocaust researchers:

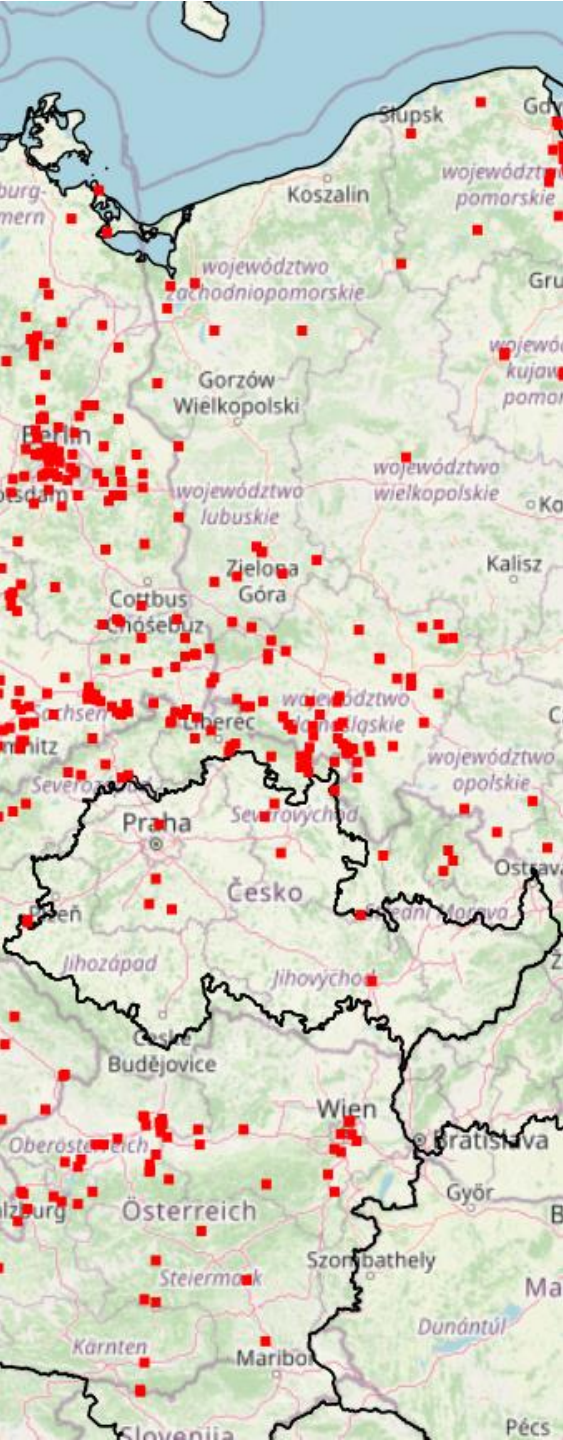

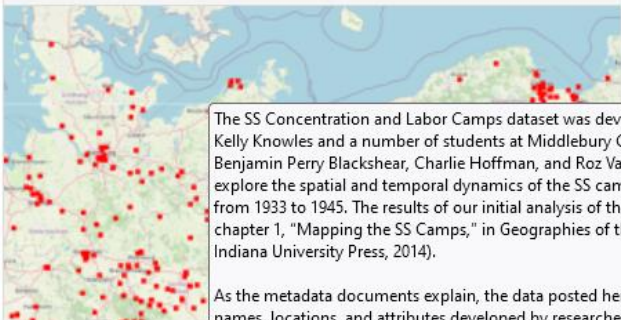

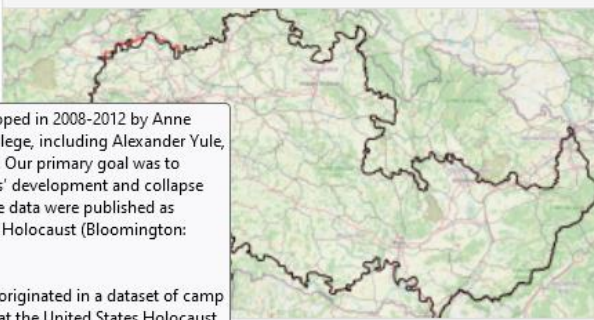
## SS Concentration camps



The SS Concentration and Labor Camps dataset was developed in 2008-2012 by Anne Kelly Knowles and a number of students at Middlebury College, including Alexander Yule, Benjamin Perry Blackshear, Charlie Hoffman, and Roz Vara. Our primary goal was to explore the spatial and temporal dynamics of the SS camps' development and collapse from 1933 to 1945. The results of our initial analysis of these data were published as chapter 1, "Mapping the SS Camps," in *Geographies of the Holocaust* (Bloomington: Indiana University Press, 2014).

As the metadata documents explain, the data posted here originated in a dataset of camp names, locations, and attributes developed by researchers at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum as part of the USHMM Encyclopedia of Camps and Ghettos, vol. 1, *Early Camps, Youth Camps, and Concentration Camps and Subcamps under the SS-Administration Main Office (WVHA)* (Bloomington: Indiana University Press, 2009), edited by the late Geoffrey P. Megargee. We are grateful to Geoff and his colleagues at USHMM for inspiring and assisting us over the years. Any errors in the data are ours alone. If you find mistakes, please contact Anne Knowles.

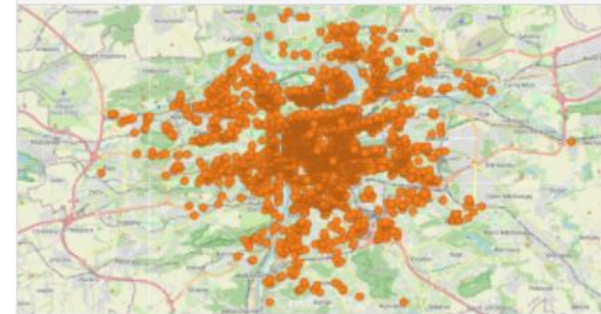

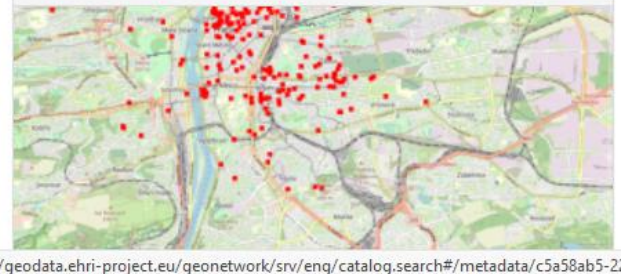

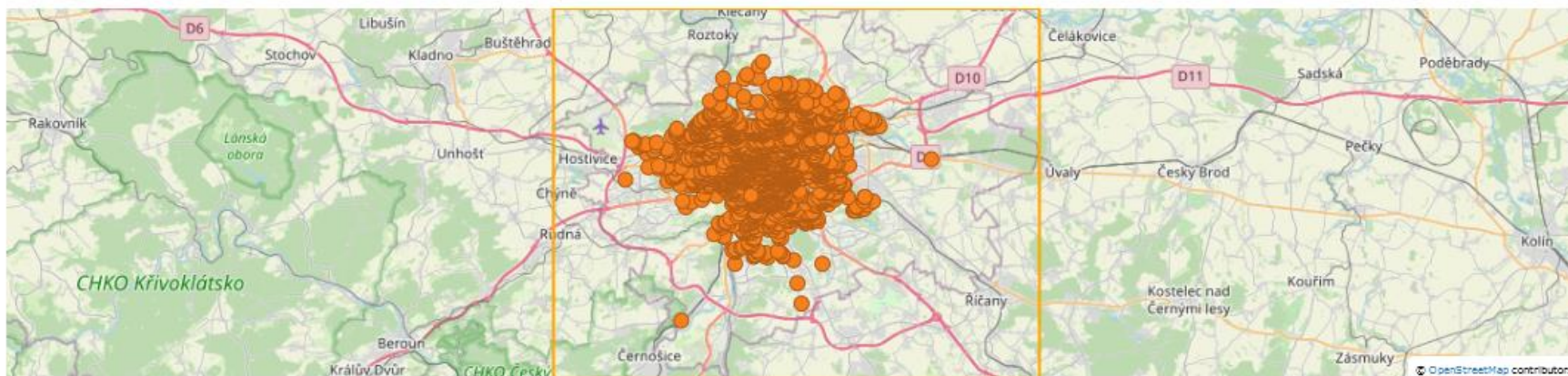
The dataset was created as a part of the MemoGIS project. MemoGIS allows users to explore data about the Holocaust directly related to the city of Prague and the locations within it.

The home addresses of Prague's Jewish residents during the Shoah from the victims' database. The dataset provides statistical information on people who lived in a particular building, their fates, and the numbers of those present on various dates during the occupation. Some buildings were difficult to identify and in those cases multiple addresses (for example, on the same street) are grouped under the same coordinates. The street names used during the occupation (roughly 1941-1942) were kept.



## Lineage

The data mostly comes from the registration of Jews in the Protectorate, which began in the fall of 1941 by order of the Central Office for Jewish Emigration. The addresses were transcribed and systematised by the Terezín Initiative and geocoded in the framework of the MemoGIS Prague project. The statistical information comes from the database of victims of the Terezín Initiative Institute.
